

**PLEASE NOTE THESE CRDTC GUIDELINES:**

- ◆ **Equipment:** Handlers should use a standard training collar (slip collar) or buckle collar, and a 6-foot leather or fabric leash. Other equipment must be approved by the instructor.
- ◆ **Requirements:** Handlers should be at least 15 years old. Except for puppy class, dogs must be at least 5 months old with all vaccinations up to date. Female dogs in heat may not attend class.
- ◆ **Check-in:** Handlers should check in at the front desk before each class. Family and friends are welcome to observe as long as they remain seated quietly. Children must be supervised.
- ◆ **Control:** It is your responsibility to have your dog under positive control at all times. Any dog that attacks another dog or person is subject to immediate removal from class. The club assumes no liability for the actions of any dog, owner, or handler.
- ◆ **No abuse of dogs will be permitted or tolerated.**
- ◆ **Clean-up:** “Exercise” your dog before coming to class. You must clean up after your dog both inside or outside the building. CRDTC provides the necessary supplies.
- ◆ **Holidays:** No classes on Labor Day or between Christmas and New Year’s Day. Training will be held on the Wednesday immediately following Columbus Day, Martin Luther King Day, Presidents Day, and Memorial Day.
- ◆ **Inclement weather:** A notice on the status of classes will be posted on the club Web site at [www.crdtc.org](http://www.crdtc.org). If the roads and parking lot are plowed, there's a good chance classes will be held as usual.
- ◆ **Refund policy:** NO REFUNDS after classes start. In extremely unusual circumstances, please speak to the CRDTC president.

## Location / Directions

Classes are held indoors at the *UMass Field Station, 240 Beaver Street, Waltham MA.*

From Route 128: Take Exit 28A Trapelo Rd east toward Belmont. After 3 to 4 miles, turn right onto Route 60. Take Route 60 West to Beaver St (traffic light with Shell gas station on the corner). Turn right onto Beaver St and go about 100 yards. The UMass Field Station is a brick building, on the left. Enter the driveway just past the building.

From Route 20: From the east, turn right at Lyman St (landmark: Kentucky Fried Chicken on the corner); From the west, turn left at Lyman St. Proceed to the DeVincent Circle rotary. Go through the rotary to Beaver St. Continue straight past Bentley College to 240 Beaver St. The UMass Field Station is on the right.

## Beginner Obedience Course

This basic obedience course meets once per week on Mondays, 6:00-6:45pm. Fee: \$125. No classes on Monday holidays—training will be held on the following Wednesday.

- This course will teach YOU how to train your dog using a clicker. Coursework is based on the Canine Good Citizen exercises. Includes: walking on a loose lead, sit, down, stay, come when called, walking on lead with distractions, meeting new people and dogs, supervised separation.
- No dogs at the first class, which meets 6:00-7:30pm. Operant conditioning using a clicker as the conditioned reinforcer will be explained. Different style collars will be demonstrated and discussed. Shaping will be described and class members will participate in exercises to learn and improve timing. There will be weekly assignments for home practice.

**REQUIREMENTS:** For one handler per dog. Handlers should be at least 15 years old. Dogs must be at least 5 months old with all vaccinations up to date. Female dogs in heat may not attend class.

PRE-REGISTRATION IS REQUIRED FOR THIS COURSE. *Class size is limited and this course often fills.* To reserve a place, call Margaret at 781 894-4315.

## Puppy Classes

### ▶ Puppy Kindergarten

Meets Fridays, 6:30-7:20pm for 6 weeks. For puppies 8–16 weeks of age at start of class.

### ▶ Advanced Puppy Course

Meets Fridays 7:30-8:20pm for 6 weeks. For puppies at least 16 weeks of age at the start of class.

**REQUIREMENTS:** Puppies must be on a schedule of routine vaccinations. It is recommended the pup have had a series of two vaccinations.
